Re: Yonge North Subway Extension and St. Anthony Catholic Elementary School at 141 Kirk Drive, Markham ON

Dear Mr. Wright & Metrolinx Board of Directors,

On behalf of the York Catholic District School Board, I am writing to express our concern regarding the proposed alignment of the Yonge-North Subway Extension and the detrimental effect this alignment will have on the safety and well-being of students and staff at St. Anthony Catholic Elementary School, located at 141 Kirk Drive, in Thornhill, ON.

The background report initially released included three proposed alignments, all three avoided the school site completely. Shortly after release a revised option three was identified as the preferred alignment, with this alignment directly impacting our St. Anthony Catholic Elementary School.

The Board is seriously concerned with the lack of transparency with respect to the rationale (or what appears to be a lack of rationale) to support the "preferred alignment" and the absence of consultation with Board staff and the school community given the location of the proposed alignment directly under our St. Anthony Catholic Elementary School.


At a time when the province is encouraging students to return to school, and the emphasis placed on a "normal" school environment, Metrolinx has requested access to the school site to perform geotechnical investigations. This invasive investigation requiring numerous tests and 2 drill machines would be a serious disruption to students and staff at the school. The requested access to the site is proposed to be required for six weeks, with storage of equipment and materials on site which presents a substantial safety hazard for students along with the disruptive and unsightly condition.

The Board wishes to avoid the long term impact of a tunnel beneath the school, the impact on the structure, health and well-being of students, and the regular disruption to the learning environment. We request that Metrolinx reconsider the subway alignment given the sensitivity around the safety and disruption to students.
